Chuyên đề được biên soạn nhằm mục đích hỗ trợ cho việc dạy học giáo trình *English Unlimited Pre-intermediate* (ấn bản lần 1, 2010) của NXB Cambridge. Nội dung Chuyên đề bao gồm 2 phần:
